**This Index Makes the Warren Report a More Usable Document—**

...all now will be able to test the assertions and conclusions in the Warren Report against the facts contained in the huge, labyrinthine record of the investigation into the assassination of President John F. Kennedy.

This Subject Index classifies the data in the 26 volumes of Hearings and Exhibits (containing the transcripts of the testimony of witnesses and the documents), as well as the information in the Warren Report itself, according to a rationalized system of subjects. The objective is to help the reader find all the information of direct or indirect relevance to any single aspect of the evidence, item by item.

A selected supplementary name index citing exhibit numbers for some key witnesses is also included in this book.

This new Index makes the Warren Commission's Report and records more coherent and usable, and should be available in all libraries.
