Dear Dr Shaw,

I have now received a copy of the Subject Index to the Warren Report and would like to express my pleasure in the appearance of the book and its general accuracy. There are only a very few errors, and they are minor. However, I have prepared an errata sheet, consisting almost exclusively of my own afterthoughts and additions which were too late to be inserted. I don't know whether or not it is your practice to issue errata sheets but I thought I would send it along anyhow--just in case there should be a second printing.

Recently I was asked to check the accuracy of a manuscript dealing with the Warren Report, written by a friend of mine and to be published very soon (by June, according to the present schedule), by one of the major houses. I was told that there is a hard-core market of 200,000 people who will buy anything on the subject of the Warren Report (even if they don't read what they buy). The figure does seem astonishingly high, but that is what the publisher's research has indicated. In any event, I am convinced that this book will make a major impact and will arouse public interest almost in the same degree as the Warren Report itself, when it was released.

I mention this because I suspect that there may be more of a market for the Subject Index than seemed likely a few months ago; especially if Searscrow Press, Inc. would consider placing a small advertisement in one or two of the periodicals which have published material on the assassination (i.e., The New Leader, The Reporter, The Nation, The New Republic, Liberation, etc.). The rates, I am told, are extremely reasonable. I realize that it is not your general practice to advertise to the public at large, but I hope that you would be willing to consider it in this case.

I am sending copies of this letter, for information, to Mr Daub at your New York office and to Mrs Hardy at New Brunswick, with the same enclosure (errata sheet).

Again, let me thank you and your associates for pleasant assistance and helpfulness at all times.
