

Mrs. R. A. REID, Clerical Supervisor, Texas School Book Depository (TSBD) Building, Houston and Elm Streets, Dallas, advised that on November 22, 1963, she was observing the Presidential Motorcade moving down Elm Street from a position in front of the TSBD Building, and shortly after the shooting of President JOHN FITZGERALD KENNEDY by an unknown person, she proceeded back to her office on the second floor of the TSBD. As she entered the office, she observed LEO HARVEY OSWALD, whose name she did not know at the time, but whom she had previously seen, and whose name she later ascertained from newspaper publicity, coming from the back hallway which is used as an aisleway between the warehouse and the clerical offices. OSWALD was carrying a coca cola in his right hand.

Mrs. REID stated that to the best of her recollection, OSWALD was wearing a white tee-shirt and a pair of pants, color unknown. She stated that she had never seen OSWALD wear a regular shirt.

Mrs. REID was shown a rust brown sport shirt with a hole in the right sleeve at the elbow, which, according to arresting officers, was being worn by OSWALD at the time of his arrest on November 22, 1963. She said that she could not recall ever seeing this shirt before and was certain that OSWALD did not have this shirt on at the time she saw him on November 22, 1963.
