The following investigation was conducted by SA
ALFRED D. NEEDLEY:

On January 27, 1964, Mr. RAY ZAUBER, Editor, Oak Cliff
Tribune, 3833 Tribune, Dallas, Texas, advised that WARREN
REYNOLDS, white male, age 28, whom he described as being the
person who followed OSWALD after Officer THIPPET was killed on
November 22, 1963, was shot on the night of January 23, 1964,
while he was in a telephone booth at his brother's (JOHN
REYNOLDS) used car lot, 500 East Jefferson Street.

According to Mr. ZAUBER, REYNOLDS was shot through the
head with a .22 rifle, and neither the assailant nor the rifle
had been identified. ZAUBER stated that REYNOLDS was in a
critical condition and in one of the Dallas hospitals.

Mr. ZAUBER stated that after he learned of this shooting,
he telephoned Captain WILHELM FRITZ, Dallas Police Department, and
asked him if there was any connection between the shooting of
WARREN REYNOLDS and the OSWALD case, and Captain FRITZ stated
that they were considering that as a possibility.
