

Dear Mr. Stamm,

I appreciate your sending us the enclosed manuscript, although you can understand that it is, in a way, also a problem. The whole subject of the assassination continues to be a problem for us. Last week we met with Vincent Salandria, to look over some new photographic material which he has brought to light, and next week I am going to follow this up by attempting to view the Nix films taken near the grassy knoll. I have no idea at present if anything for publication will result from this or not.

We also have on hand an article relating to the shooting of Tippitt. Although it is very convincing and suggestive in itself, we have not been able to decide to use it yet, because all it really accomplishes is to raise another new set of questions about what might have happened, without providing any conclusive answers. We don't mind ever raising questions about any subject, but in the case of the assassination, it is clear that this process can go on forever. It is not clear that any conclusive answers are ever going to be forthcoming, on the basis of information presently available, simply by re-analyzing it. So, in the main, we are much more open to raising a demand that information and evidence that the Warren Commission possesses be made public, such as the photographic evidence from the autopsy and various sections of movies taken in Dallas which have not yet been released.
