Did you have a productive summer?

I think we ought to meet again so that among other things you can bring me up to date. But I want to wait until the teachers' strike is over and I no longer live in the shadow of crisis and in the midst of minute-to-minute discussions and evaluations of union tactics. Then I will call.

"Parade" of Sept. 15, 1968, a Sunday supplement included in the ~~Sunday~~ Long Island Press and other papers had a full page account by Jack Anderson of Jim Bishop's forthcoming book, "The Day Kennedy Was Shot," which is scheduled to appear on the anniversary of the

assassination. Anderson summarizes Bishop's findings: Oswald "alone & unaided gunned down Kennedy;" O "made no real attempt to escape;" and Bishop "suggests he wanted to be captured;"

Much is based on an "exclusive account" of Johnson's actions on Nov. 22 given by the latter, who refused to talk to Manchester, to Bishop. Oddly, Anderson makes no reference to the Warren Commission and to its Report. I wonder why
