"The FBI and Secret Service are vigorously competing to become the dominant federal police force ...

the two services have long eyed one another with apprehension. They quarreled openly at the Warren Commission; the FBI accused the Secret Service of poor security in Dallas, and the Secret Service charged the FBI had denied it intelligence data which would have made it possible to avoid

the assassination. (!!) Both emerged  
humiliated but with a joint intelligence
