Dear Mr. Stamm:

This is in reply to your letters of July 17 and 24, 1975, concerning the records of the Warren Commission.

Thank you for your kind remarks concerning the service you received from the National Archives. We regret that we have found no information to add to that which you have in your letter of July 17 concerning the number of transcripts and agenda of executive sessions of the Commission, the number of those sessions, or why an agenda was not adopted for each session.

Enclosed is a copy of the file classification manual of the Commission, which we believe is the subject index referred to in the memorandum you mention.

No minutes of the autopsy of President Kennedy or any other reference to minutes of the autopsy than the one you mention have been found in the records of the Commission.

We have only an electrostatic copy of the death certificate signed by Dr. Clark, but the phrase to which you refer appears to be "Gunshot of Brain."

Concerning your question about the reason for two death certificates, we can only suggest that this may be because President Kennedy died in, Dallas, Texas, and the autopsy was performed at Bethesda, Maryland. We do not know why neither certificate was published by the Commission.

We do not know of any other documents that relate to your question concerning the O'Neill-Sibert receipt for a missile removed by Commander Humes. Enclosed is a copy of the O'Neill-Sibert report of November 26, 1963, concerning the autopsy. To our knowledge, it was not published by the Commission.

We can furnish you electrostatic copies of the FBI Summary Report (396 p.) for \$59.40 and the Supplemental Report (98 p.) for \$14.70.
