Dear Mr. Stamm:

This is in reply to your letter of August 22, 1975, concerning the records of the Warren Commission.

Mrs. John F. Kennedy testified before the Commission and is listed as a witness in the index to Hearings of the Commission. Enclosed is a copy of a page from the transcript of her testimony before the Commission. The portions of the testimony enclosed in brackets were deleted in her published testimony (Hearings, vol. V, p. 180). The page with the deleted portions was declassified in 1972. The transcript of Mrs. Kennedy's testimony is included in the transcripts of testimony of the Commission described in entry 37 of the inventory of the records of the Commission.

We consult other agencies, particularly the Departments of State, the Treasury, and Justice, and the Central Intelligence Agency, concerning documents they originated or in whose subject matter those agencies have an interest, as to whether the documents should be made available for research. The numbered documents of the Commission that are withheld from research are indicated in the "List of Basic Source Materials" of the Commission. The unnumbered documents that are withheld, consisting chiefly of correspondence and memorandums of the Commission, are not listed.
