HARD CHOICES: Four Critical Years In America's Foreign Policy by Cyrus Vance (Simon & Schuster, \$19.95) is a narrative of the Carter administration's policies by former Secretary of State Vance.

THE ARBOR HOUSE TREASURY OF DETECTIVE AND MYSTERY STORIES FROM THE GREAT PULPS edited by Bill Pronzini (Arbor House, \$16.95).

NUCLEAR INC.: The Men and Money Behind Nuclear Energy by Mark Hertsgaard (Pantheon, \$16.95).

PAY DIRT: And Other Whispering Sands Stories of Gold Fever and the Western Desert by Erle Stanley Gardner, edited by Charles Waugh and Martin Greenberg (Morrow, \$15.95), a collection of nine stories, portrays the Southwest of the 1930s.

VOICES: A Memoir by Frederic Prokosch (Farrar, Straus & Giroux, \$17.95) is a record of people talking and a portrait of the author, novelist, poet, lepidopterist, wartime agent, world traveler and printer of private editions — the listener.

THE THREAT: Inside the Soviet Military Machine by Andrew Cockburn (Random House, \$16.95) looks at the human factor as well as inventories of weaponry.

LOWENSTEIN: Acts of Courage and Belief, edited by Gregory Stone and Douglas Lowenstein (Harcourt Brace Jovanovich, \$18.85; paper \$9.95) is "the authoritative record of the struggle for human justice and freedom of a man who became an American political legend, documented in his own words and in first-hand accounts by writers" — the story of Allard K. Lowenstein who was assassinated in March 1980.
