

Official evidence from the Robert F. Kennedy assassination which is reportedly lost, missing or destroyed:

1. "Two boards from door frame" from the Ambassador Hotel pantry, booked into evidence, containing what are described in FBI reports as "bullet holes."
2. An object reported to be a bullet clearly embedded in a door frame in police evidence photographs.
3. Two ceiling tiles taken from the pantry, through which bullets fired in the shooting apparently passed. These are important to reconstructing bullet flight paths and the number of bullets fired in the shooting.
4. X-rays or specialized photographs of the above evidence.
5. A bullet reportedly recovered from Sirhan Sirhan's pocket following the shooting.
6. The results of spectrographic tests said to have been taken during evidence examinations.
7. Documentation from the test-firing of Sirhan's gun reportedly performed by DeWayne Wolfer, LAPD criminalist on the case. (Only one photomicrograph, misidentified by Wolfer in 1975, has ever come to light from the 1968 bullet comparisons. The 1975 firearms panel was unable to substantiate the matches to Sirhan's gun asserted in 1968.)
8. The left sleeve of Senator Kennedy's suit coat and shirt.
9. The report of police sergeant Paul Sharaga regarding suspects seen leaving the Ambassador Hotel shortly following the shooting.
10. Iver Johnson Cadet revolver number H18602, reportedly used as a substitute for Sirhan's gun in disputed evidence tests in the case.
