

AGREEMENT

AGREEMENT made this day (a) between the licensor (b) and University Microfilms Library Services, Xerox Education Division, the licensee in the matter of reproduction of copies of the title (c), (b) the licensor asserts that the rights herein assigned are his to assign.

In consideration of a royalty of 10 percent of the invoiced sales price of each copy of (c) sold, the licensor grants to the licensee the exclusive privilege of microfilming and making complete copies of (c), either as positive microfilm or by xerography, or by any other method whereby copies can be produced one at a time. Nothing in this agreement should be construed as limiting the normal copying or microfilming activities of libraries. Royalties will be paid once each year.

It is understood that the regular printed edition of (c) is exhausted, and that it is the desire of (b) to make copies available to libraries and others through the services of University Microfilms, who will produce copies of (c) as demand requires.

This agreement is further subject to the following considerations:

1. The book will be photographed in its entirety, including the title page and copyright notice and subsequent notices.
 2. Sales of copies of this book are: (unrestricted) (restricted to the following countries: _____)
 3. It is anticipated that there will be no inventory of completed copies, and that a copy will be produced as each request is received.
 4. Whenever possible a copy of (c) will be supplied by the licensor (b) to the licensee, with the understanding that it will be photographed and returned promptly, unharmed.
 5. The rights hereby granted to the licensee are not assignable, except to its associate company, University Microfilms, Ltd.
 6. The licensee will assume all responsibility for shipping, billing and collecting.
- This agreement may be terminated by either party upon 60 days notice.

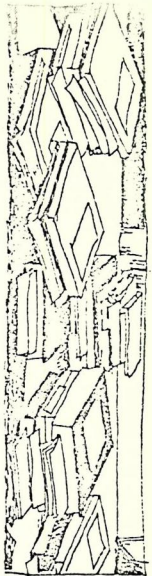

coating and obtaining out-of-print books has always been a problem for individuals and libraries alike. Now, however, it is possible for o-p titles to be made available in editions as small as a single copy or in runs of dozens of copies. Through arrangements with the world's leading libraries and publishers, practically any book listed as o-p can be produced for you at surprisingly low cost by University Microfilms Library Services, Xerox Education Division. Thousands of titles have already been filmed by University Microfilms and are available for prompt shipment, and more are being added to the collection each month. The program works as follows:

1. For titles not in University Microfilms' collection

A. You request University Microfilms to produce either microfilm or xerographic copies of the o-p book. Submit as much information about the book as possible, i.e., author, title, publisher, publication date and location of an original copy, if known.

B. When necessary, University Microfilms will contact the original publisher and receive permission to reproduce the book. This service sometimes delays shipment.

C. University Microfilms then locates a copy of the book and photographs it page by page as 35mm microfilm. After the negative microfilm has been inspected for accuracy it is added to University Microfilms' microfilm library where it is ready for reproduction as positive microfilm or as xerographically-reproduced copies.

D. When the filming operation is completed, the requested copy or copies are produced, bound and shipped to you.

E. This entire service—searching, filming, reproduction and royalty payments (when necessary)—is performed for a total cost of 4 cents per page for all titles printed in the U. S. and Canada (except those in Russian) and all titles printed anywhere in English. For titles printed in Russian and for foreign language books printed outside the U. S. and Canada, the cost is 6 cents per page. These prices include perfect (glued) binding with a soft 65-lb. paper cover, and an author-title label on the front cover. Cloth covers can be ordered for an additional \$2.25 for books up to 12 in. in height, and \$3.50 for those over 12 in. in height. Xerographic copies are produced on long-life, non-acidic paper. Copies on microfilm are approximately one-third the cost of xerographic copies. The minimum charge for any order is \$3.00, and a modest packing and shipping charge is added to all orders.

F. If you do not have a copy of the book from which to estimate the price, the number of pages might be found in *A Catalog of Books Reprinted by Library of Congress Printed Cards Issued to July 31, 1942*, and its supplements. The approximate price can be determined by multiplying the number of pages by 4 cents or 6 cents, whichever is applicable.

G. Should you have a copy of the book at your disposal or know where one can be located, please let University Microfilms know, because this information will be very helpful in completing your request. Books are not damaged in the microfilming process and will be returned to the owner in the condition received.

II. For titles already in the University Microfilms collection:

A. If you need an out-of-print book which is in University Microfilms' collection, simply order a microfilm or xerographic copy of the title. Prices are shown in the University Microfilms O-P Catalog, and are calculated the same as for books not in the collection. (See paragraph E above.) (Ordering by the order number and name of author listed in the University Microfilms O-P catalog will expedite shipment.)

B. When your order is received, the master negative is withdrawn from the film library, the requested copy is reproduced and sent to you.



Printing

When 50 or more complete copies are wanted and the quantity is known in advance, University Microfilms uses offset printing to reproduce o-p books. Offset plates are prepared from microfilm. By keeping the plate cost low, small editions can be inexpensively produced. As the quantity of copies increases, the unit cost rapidly declines. In offset printing, all illustrative materials in the original reproduce well. Quotations will be given for specific press runs, bindings, etc.

Customer-Submitted Microfilm

If you already have microfilm you would like enlarged and bound into book form, send the film to University Microfilms for review and pricing. Customer-submitted film is enlarged for 8 cents per running foot of paper 12 in. wide, including a paper cover and title-author label. The minimum charge is \$3.00. Because the Xerox Copyflo process provides for continuous enlargement of microfilm, the spaces be-

tween exposures are enlarged as well as the pages themselves. Some extra footage is required for leader and trailers.

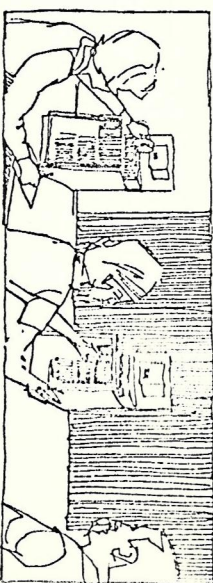
Xerography

In xerographic process, microfilm images are projected page by page onto a revolving drum, which transfers the image to an endless web of paper. The separate pages are usually cut from the web, folded and bound for convenience. The image is as permanent as the paper, which is specially made to University Microfilms' specifications for long life.

Since, by xerography, only one side of the sheet is printed, the pages are cut from the web of paper in pairs and then folded in such a way that there appears to be printing on both sides of a single sheet. Double pages of this sort of heavy paper would result in a thick, hard-to-manage book, so lightweight and opaque (13 pound) book paper selected for strength is used.

In photographing, an opening, or pair of pages, is exposed at one time. In folding the xerographic pages, the gutter of the original book becomes the fore-edge. This has the effect of placing the odd-numbered pages on the left instead of on the right as in the original. The pages remain in sequence, of course.

Halftone and continuous tone enlargements are not reproduced well by xerography. Charts, graphs, line drawing and similar data reproduce well, however. Upon request, silver print reproductions (photographs) can be made of pages where this quality reproduction is desired. Normal price is 30 cents per print.
