Congressman Theodore R. Kupferman has suggested that I write to you and send you a copy of my Subject Index to the Warren Report and the Hearings and Exhibits. Unfortunately, the Index is now out of print. I am down to one copy, which I use myself. I am really anxious for you to see the Index but I don't know where I can get a copy, even on loan. The National Archives may have one with its Warren Commission collection—perhaps if you sometimes go to the Archives, you could look at their copy.

I am glad to hear that you intend to do another column on this subject and I look forward to receiving a copy. Ropefully, it will eliminate any possibility that my Index will be under suspicion of CIA sponsorship. I am sure that you understand my concern to prevent any such impression.

Congressman Kupferman indicates that you suggested that there are several published indices, including one issued by the Government. Perhaps you had in mind the name index which appears at the end of Volume XV of the Hearings and Exhibits. I have been unable to find a trace of any index other than my own and will be most interested to learn of any others which are published.

Again, my regrets at being without a copy of the Index to send you.
