Dear Mrs. Meagher:

Thank you, in return, for your kind remarks about my review of your <u>Subject Index to the Warren Report and Hearings & Exhibits</u> in the <u>American Archivist</u>, of which I happen also to be the editor. I am very much obliged to you for the errata sheets, and I am taking the liberty of giving photocopies of them to the National Archives Library and to the archivists who work with the Warren Commission's records. I should say to you, however, that my official work in the National Archives does not bring me into direct contact with the Warren Commission consideration--my interest in J.F.K. is centered rather in a private venture of collecting and of developing a definitive bibliography that I may have ready to publish in 1968 or 1969.

It would be too bad to leave your <u>Index</u> out of print. I discussed it yesterday with Mr. H. B. Schnapper, director of the Public Affairs Press (419 New Jersey Avenue S.E., Washington, D.C. 20003), who authorizes me to tell you that he would be happy to receive from you a proposal for the publication of a <u>revision</u>. I suggest that you send Mr. Schnapper a prospectus--it would be well to send him a copy of the Scarecrow edition, which he has not seen.
