AUBREY RAY LINDSEY, Mechanic, Goodyear Service Center, Plaza Shopping Center, telephone No. AD 5-4536, advised he resides at 13425 Brookgreen, Dallas, Texas.

LINDSEY stated he formerly operated his own shop, The Taylor Motor Company, 4312 Ross Avenue, Dallas, Texas. He said while operating this business, MALCOLM J. HOY was a customer of his. LINDSEY advised that on November 22, 1963, he had HOY's car in his shop for repairs. He stated HOY stopped by the shop and asked him if one of LINDSEY's employees would drive him to downtown Dallas so he could view the Presidential motorcade. LINDSEY stated he let one of his employees drive HOY to downtown Dallas. LINDSEY stated he cannot now recall which of his employees drove HOY to downtown Dallas.

LINDSEY advised that shortly before HOY returned to LINDSEY's repair shop he had heard radio broadcasts announcing that President KENNEDY had been shot. LINDSEY stated when HOY returned he commented to him that President KENNEDY was shot twice "because I was there watching it." At this time, LINDSEY stated the radio broadcasts had only stated that President KENNEDY had been shot. LINDSEY stated he has not seen HOY for a number of months and believes he last resided at 4310 San Jacinto, Dallas, Texas. He said he attempted to locate HOY at this address and was informed by the landlady that HOY was a very strange individual. She said the walls and furniture in his room were "filled with bullet holes" and she asked HOY to move which he did. LINDSEY said he does not know HOY's present whereabouts but believes he was employed on the assembly line by General Motors at the Arlington, Texas plant.

LINDSEY advised that other than the above he had no information which would assist in the investigation of the assassination of President KENNEDY.
