JAMES OLIVER STACY was interviewed at his place of employment, Doran Chevrolet, 2222 Main, Dallas, Texas, at which time STACY was advised of the identity of the interviewers as Special Agents of the FBI. STACY was advised that he did not have to make a statement and that any statement he did make would be voluntary and could be used against him in a court of law. He was advised of his right to consult an attorney.

STACY stated that he had no objection to talking with agents of the FBI. STACY was asked if he had ever indicated that he had something to do with the telescopic sight on the weapon used in the assassination of President JOHN F. KENNEDY. STACY replied that he had never at any time stated that he had something to do with the telescopic sight on the assassination weapon and he denied emphatically that he had ever made such a statement or a similar statement or that he at any time had actually fixed the sight on the assassination weapon. STACY further denied ever having known LEE HARVEY OSWALD. Photographs of LEE HARVEY OSWALD and JACK RUBY were displayed to STACY and he denied having ever seen these individuals or ever having known them. STACY stated that he was employed by Moore and Carpenter Inc., Dallas, Texas, as a gunsmith and clerk from February, 1961 to March, 1963. In this capacity he had worked on guns and had fixed gun sights to rifles. He had no recollection of ever having seen OSWALD at Moore and Carpenter, Inc. He recalled that following the assassination of President KENNEDY he had wondered what type of weapon had been used and he may have expressed to various individuals not recalled, that he had fixed a sight on an Argentine Mauser 7.65 Caliber Rifle for a man named JOE UNDERWOOD. STACY stated that this Argentine Mauser had no connection with the assassination of President KENNEDY, however, he had commented regarding it following the assassination only because he was concerned about what type of weapon had been used in the assassination.

STACY recalled that he had recently gone to a rifle range in the vicinity of the Sports Drome Speedway in the 8000 Block, Davis Road, Grand Prairie, Texas in order to practice shooting his rifle. While at the rifle range he overheard some of the personnel at the rifle range discussing that LEE HARVEY OSWALD had been to the rifle range at one time or another.

The following is a description of STACY as obtained through observation and interview:
