EDWARD FULBRIGHT, owner, Ed's Fawn Shop, was interviewed at his place of business, 616 E. Irving Boulevard, Irving Texas. Mr. FULBRIGHT stated he bought out W. A. GRAVES in January, 1963, at which time GRAVES was operating a small gun shop in the space occupied by the Furniture Mart on E. Irving Boulevard, Irving, Texas. FULBRIGHT stated that GRAVES continued to work for him, FULBRIGHT, for a period of four weeks after he bought the business, with GRAVES being terminated on February 16, 1963. He stated during this period of time GRAVES worked at Ed's Pawn Shop, 616 E. Irving Boulevard, as a gunsmith and he, FULBRIGHT, has not had a gunsmith or performed any repair work on guns since GRAVES was terminated.

Mr. FULBRIGHT stated he has observed numerous photographs of LEE HARVEY OSWALD during recent months and he has no recollection whatsoever of ever meeting or seeing LEE HARVEY OSWALD and specifically has no recollection of OSWALD ever visiting Ed's Pawn Shop or making inquiry regarding any type of gun repair.
