Please be sure to see Ramparts for January 1967 "The Case for Three Assassine" and particularly the conclusions of Dr. Hiddle about the head shot in frame 313.

A question: When we saw the screening of the Zapruder film two weeks ago, was the film projected at the same speed as the camera took the photographs? I expect not, or we could have timed the whole and divided by the number of frames, in order to establish the frames-per-second. I ask this question because after talking last might to the California researchers I learned that they still believe that Weisberg may be right about the 2h frames per second. Two of the researchers independently had contacted the Bell & Howell people in los Angeles; both had been told that there is a model consistent with the description of Zapruder's camera on which the speed can be set at 2h.

I'll be interested to know what you think of the Ramparts piece.
