O'Brien Says the President Governs by Suppression

Mr. O'Brien, in a speech at the National Press Club, said that President Nixon "has settled on a process of govern-ment that is totally dependent on the most exclusive élite of all—himself with one or two

all—himself with one or two advisers."

"There is no communication, no exchange of ideas at a time when the American political system is facing its gravest crisis of confidence since the Civil War," he said.

Mr. O'Brien said that, while the Democrats had reformed their party to assure "the people, all the people, are counted in," the Republican party "continues to operate behind the closed doors of its exclusive club, accountable only to itself."
