Dear Mike, A copy of the printout we discussed last night is enclosed. It's from the New Orleans Public Library obituary file and lists Sidney E. Voebel. This was given me (and made available to H.S.C.A. along with all I have on this New Orleans area) by Collin B. Hamer, Jr. He works in the Louisiana Division of the library and reports to have known Voebel, been in the C.A.P. at the same time as Oswald and Ferrie, and generally familiar with C.A.P. activities. His wife told me she taught the Voebel children and knew Voebel's widow, Betty.

Hamer also provided a C.A.P. roster which lists Oswald and other members. Through him I was introduced to a Mary Berkowitz at the present C.A.P. who in turn supplied me with a one inch thick C.A.P. personnel file on Ferrie (in exchange for the 75 pp. of W.C. documents on C.A.P. members). Reports are the F.B.I. took a three inch file.

I've lots more related to give you on this and will get off a more extensive memo this weekend. Important are Magyar, possibly Murret, and tales of Adrian Alba. Recall that Magyar was a pilot acquainted with Ferrie and who got a Mexican visa at the time Oswald did.
