

David Lifton, Warren Commission researcher, advises that in 1973 while conducting a film search in connection with a movie production he discovered film footage in a New York City library. This footage, he explains, was taken in the ante-room of the office of Captain Will Fritz, Dallas Police Dept. It is 35mm., black and white, taken with the clock showing 2:03 C.S.T., just as Lee Harvey Oswald is being led in. Seated and in view are Texas School Book Depository employees. Among the employees is Billy Nolan Lovelady. This is an opportunity to view and compare the two men and, as Mr. Lifton interprets it, see how the resemblance explains Lovelady's being confused with Oswald. He adds that when the two mens' shirts are seen on black and white film it is evident that Lovelady's shirt could well have been that in the Altgens photograph(C.E.369)

The duplicate of this footage which Mr. Lifton has in his apartment in California, by referring to what he recalls may have been numbered markings, can provide a trace to the original in the New York library. He explained that in that the search took place in numeruos N.Y.C. libraries it will be necessary for him to refer to his copy to locate the original and the name of the photographer.
