

## A. FBI DOCUMENTS

I've just received about 287 pages from the FBI (PLH #933 thru 1081). These come from New Orleans files on LHO and the FPCC, and a couple of files on Marina. (There is still more to come.) My request was for pre-assassination records, but they are sending some post-assassination items too. (It's not clear what criterion is involved.)

I have sent Sylvia, Mary, and Peter the 26 pages of inventory worksheets, the 86 pages of pre-ass'n stuff (less 17 pp. in #1012 and #1036), and 48 post-ass'n pages. [#993-1003, 1008-12, 1014-5, 1018, 1022, 1024-5, 1026 (first 2 pp), 1027-8, 1031-61, 1063-4, 1066, 1072, 1075-6, 1078, 1081.] The inventory worksheets have been annotated, so I haven't made my usual lists yet.

I've given these documents only a cursory reading. The most interesting item: before the ass'n, the FBI in N.O. ignored a specific suggestion that they check out the 544 Camp St. ~~address~~ address. (That suggestion was made - I don't know by whom - on a previously unknown copy of the Lamont pamphlet, mailed to the FBI by Jesse Core.)

There is also a confused situation regarding LHO's "Hands Off Cuba" handbills, which I will write up separately. The bottom line is that we haven't seen the markings on the back of one copy, which may reveal the presence (which I have long suspected) of FBI agents at Oswald's 8/16/63 literature distribution. Incorrect information about which exhibit is which was definitely given to FBI HQ and to me.

## B. ARCHIVES MATERIAL

Marion Johnson has sent around a list of WC records released in 1978. I got from Bud and Harold (and have sent to Mary and Sylvia) the last 4 items, 52 pages [my count] of executive session transcripts. I intend to get the first 5 items (18 pp. of CD's) in due course.

## C. FBI DOCUMENTS - PLH PERSONAL FILE

I've gotten about 75 pages, and will get more soon; I'm holding off on numbering and distributing them until I've gotten all I can. Mostly, this deals with their response to my FOIA requests. Sort of interesting, even to others. (I think!)

## D. HSC HEARINGS

Jeff Goldberg advises that the first volumes of public hearings are being published. (So far, only MLK.) These might include exhibits which we haven't yet seen.

I am told that the HSC panel reports are still officially embargoed, but that our chances of getting them from the authors is increasing daily. Maybe we should try.

## E. CLIPPINGS

With help from Ted Rubinstein, the AIB, Bud, et al., I've now put together a fairly good collection of clippings. Definitely an incomplete collection - I only have a limited selection from the Press Intelligence service, so (for example) I don't even have all the Washington Post and Star stories on the September hearings. In all, as of today I have about a 1.5" pile for Jan.-Aug. 1978, about 2" for Sept. through Dec. '78, and about 1/2" for Jan. '79 and later. This does not include anything from the S.F. Chronicle (mostly wire-service stuff), and it does include quite a few miscellaneous intelligence-related topics. (Everything from the CIA on UFO's and the Letelier case to Rocky's death.)

Ultimately, I would like to make lists, but that's not very likely soon. For now, I would like to separate the good stuff - at most 50% - and copy it for anyone who's interested (at 3.5¢). [Especially for anyone who will make a list, or who can shell out 6.5¢ per page so that I can have a Xerox copy of the good part, for ease in future copying.] Of course, I would also like to get good clips that I have missed.

## F. OTHER

I have the transcript of the Gallery symposium of 30 Jan 79 (182 pp), if anyone's really interested.

Nothing from the CIA yet. That last batch must be a good one.
