160 votes for impeachment ... and counting

Dear Fellow Citizen:

We are for impeachment. How about you? And we have a plan to make it happen that we believe will work. We need your help. We need your name. And we need \$25 from you.

Now, today, there are roughly 160 votes in the House of Representatives for impeachment. We need another 60 votes, roughly, to make a majority in the House. Did you realize it was that close? Those 60 votes come from 60 key Congressional districts. We plan to build support in those 60 districts. We believe it can be done -- if you will help.

We are a group of ordinary citizens, like yourself, who want to preserve your Constitution. We are, for the most part, middle-of-the-roaders -- Republicans, Democrats and Independents. We believe that a President must not be permitted to commit assault and battery upon the fundamental law of the land. We believe that integrity and decency must be, and can be, restored to the White House.


There is one and only one way to begin -- by impeachment. The committee believes that there is sufficient evidence to show that the President has ignored the law, committed crimes, and broken his oath of office. The only way to know is to use the Constitutional provision for trial of these issues. The House impeaches -- the Senate tries. At the end of the trial, we'll know.
