Dear Cyril,

You were absolutely powerful and persuasive on that broadcast, which is why I was still awake in time to call in. One reason that you are so effective is your sense of balance and logic, so that any speculation on your part is predicated on specific facts and reasonable inferences. Unfortunately, the same is not true for Flammonde, who ranged so far afield on so little foundation that he threatened to undo the great effectiveness of your own presentation--as was obvious from the remarks of one listener who called in after I did.

I get infuriated when Flammonde drags in and harps on the ambivalent and immaterial statements of that senile old Southern Gentleman, Senator Russell. He did that on the broadcast with Newman as well as with you, and it is fatuous as well as mischievous, which he seems not to realize despite broad hints.

You can be sure that I will be in touch if there are any important new developments. Meanwhile, if you should get any news of the Los Angeles suit in re: RFK/Sirhan, please let me know.
