I imagine he was briefed by Fensterwald, as I recall Cook's name on the list of prospective members or directors of Fensterwald's committee. I do not know Cook, but he did an excellent joint review of Tink Thomson's book and mine, in The Nation.

I hope that you have had a chance to look over my article on Charles Givens and that you will let me know if you find any loopholes through which Ball and Belin might wriggle out.

Paris Flammonde gave me advance notice that Garrison was to appear on the Long John program last Tuesday, but I have been covering night meetings at the UN and was so tired when I got home that I didn't remember to tune in. Afterwards, I was furious with myself for my lapse—but as it turned out, I had not really missed anything. Long John mentioned last night (when I was listening, by happy accident) that Garrison had not only failed to arrive as scheduled, but had not called to say that he would not come nor called afterwards to explain or apologize. Long John's voice as he recounted this was charged with such murderous rage at this lese majesty that Garrison had better worry less about the CIA and more about NBC.
