Dear Dr. Wecht,

Thank you for your letter of the 7th and the welcome confirmation that you are willing to be associated with a request for access to the autopsy x-rays and photographs. As I wrote you by hand the other day, I have decided not to make such a request on my own behalf--and now there is a much better prospect.

Last night I took part in a two-hour broadcast on the Warren Report, together with Congressman Theodore Kupferman and others. The surrender of the autopsy documents to the Archives was of course the subject of special interest during the discussion. Afterward, I had a brief conversation with Representative Kupferman, who has just been reelected from my district, as it happens, and whom I had met once before at the same radio studio. He told me that he intended to request a viewing of the autopsy photographs, and I suggested that he should be accompanied by a forensic pathologist who would be able to evaluate the documents, specifically, by you. He was delighted with that suggestion, and I am sure that he will pursue it when the time comes--probably when Congress reconvenes.

Meanwhile, as you will be visiting New York City on December 7th for a few days, I will hope to see you and perhaps it will be possible for both of us to see Representative Kupferman and carry the matter a step further. If there is time, I would like very much to have the benefit of your advice on various aspects of the autopsy that we have mentioned but not had the time to explore fully, such as the diagram of the skull injuries.
