Dear Dr. Wecht.

Congressman Kupferman just phoned to make a definite date for the three of us to have a talk during your visit next month. We agreed to meet at my apartment on Friday might the 9th of December at 9 p.m. subject to your being swilable. If it is okay, please confirm; if you have something else that evening, please suggest one or two alternative times.

Kupferman asked me also what I thought about Dr. Milton Helpern accompanying the three of us to see the autopsy photographs, provided that we are permitted to see them (which I personally doubt will occur). I don't have any objection and I imagine you don't. He has not yet discussed the matter with Helpern, so please let me know if you have any reservations about his participation. (Maybe he will prefer not to be involved.)

Another witness has died from unnatural causes—James Worrell, the young man who testified that he saw someone run out of the back door of the Depository (see Volume II), was killed when his motorcycle collided with an abutment, on the 5th of November, in Dallas. He is the third witness to die in a motor vehicle accident—the second in three months. I wish the odds could be programmed on a computer—they seem way out of the range of probability.
