Dear Dr. Wecht,

I was glad to reach you last night in time to make the date for lunch on Thursday December 8th with Life Magazine. I jotted down and am enclosing a list of some of the questions which should be discussed during your visit; perhaps you will have time to give preliminary thought to some of the questions and let me know if it would be helpful to have any special documents available (autopsy report and diagrams, testimony, etc.) or any special facilities or equipment. If so, I will try to make sure they will be available.

The list is based on the assumption that the situation will not change materially by the 8th; but the way things are rushing to the boil, who knows? Personally, I think that the autopsy photographs have lost much of their importance--at least, in terms of the single-bullet-theory. They will still be crucial with respect to the head shot. If the conversations develop in that direction, I hope that you will be prepared to act as a consultant on questions of forensic pathology both to Congressman Kupferman and to Life. Knowing your strong and uncompromising feelings about the investigation, I am sure you will be indispensable to any effort to pin down the facts as precisely and authoritatively as possible.
