Dear Sylvia:

Thank you for your comments of 1 August 1969. I shall ask Appleton-Century-Crofts to send a copy of the book to Barry Gray.

I am very close to Tom Noguchi; in fact, I testified at Los Angeles in his behalf. We chatted by phone last Thursday, a short time after he learned of the decision by the Civil Service Commission. As far as I know, the affair involving him was not in any way directly related to the RFK assassination. Incidentally, I reviewed all the autopsy findings in that case at Los Angeles (Tom officially consulted me just a few hours after the shooting), and I can tell you that the autopsy was an excellent job in all respects. It is true that there were powder burns in at least one of RFK's wounds; however, all the bullet fragments matched up with the bullets in Sirhan's gun as tested by Neutron Activation Analysis (a very specific scientific test, which should have been used - and still could be! - in the JFK case).

I hope that Appleton-Century-Crofts agrees to do a paperback version of your book. It would be very helpful if many more people were familiar with the hard cold facts set forth in your excellent study.
