- It was good to talk to you this afternoon. Two things since thems
 (1) I bearned something, highly confidential, and I cannot tell you much about it except that it is good news for your book—there will be reviews in the fall, in highly important publications, by very high-level people, and the reviews are likely to be favorable. Please don't ask me to say snything more about it, as I got permission to say this much, but promised to say no more.
- (2) If you can, there is one piece of information which I would very much appreciate having, if and when you next visit the Archives. That is, has the FBI Supplemental Report of January 13, 1964 been declassified and made available? I am not sure, but it may carry exhibit no. 108. If you can determine one way or the other, I will be most appreciative.

One thing I should have mentioned on the phone but forget to say was that Epstein told me the other day that he has now read your book, and that he feels very favorably about it, and would say so if asked his opinion or asked to do any reviews. However, he has been turning down insistent requests for radio and TV appearances, because he does not want to undertake such public appearances, either with other critics or by himself. He was pressured into accepting the Today show, next Friday, but is trying to disengage himself and cancel it.
