As you know, it does not surprise me.


The only thing that would surprise is something

Four years ago, the UPI vice president to whom
I directed my rather forceful correspondence to Merriman
Smith the year before asked me to write UPI's Sunday piece
commemorating the assassination. Although I have always
avoided what can be misinterpreted in commemoration, I did
it. They liked it and put it on the wire. If a single
one of UPI's thousands of subscribers printed it, I have
not heard about it. It was on the wire. I have a wire
copy. Knowing the policy of the Times, as I have for
years, I am no longer even disappointed.

The one thing for which I would hope is that the
next time he faces such a decision, Salisbury will remember
this, as UPI did.

Eventually I may hear something. If and when I do,
I'll let you know.
