Dear Mr. Kleindienst,

In response to your letter to Mr. Fogelwald asking that while there was a case in court I address you through him, you got a letter under date of September 15 to which you have not replied. Unless your request was a ploy to further interfere with the kind of response I would think the Department of Justice would least want to seem to twist itself with, I still expect some kind of meaningful response. The time for reply in such cases expired yesterday since this is no longer in court.

There are other letters, raising proper points, to which there also has been no response. I herewith respectfully request that you arrange for these inquiries to be answered in some meaningful way. Mr. Buckwalter's letter of September 14 responds to nothing.

It is now more than three weeks since I filed a DF-115 form relating to withheld information from me relating to Ronnie White, a resident of New Orleans for the period in question. There has been no response, not even acknowledgement, although it may seem like weeks to Newcastle to you, I suspect that non-responses and long delays are not in accord with the purpose of letter of the Freedom of Information law.

All of this is, in my opinion, quite inconsistent with the political procedure about law and order for political gain. Procedures should practice. I wish you would, please.
