I initially requested "fairness doctrine" time ^{with the beginning of the} ~~to respond to the TV shows.~~ ^{made} Once you ~~gave the program~~ the same incorrect, ~~misleading,~~ ^{pretended} ~~deceptive,~~ carefully selected and angled, incomplete and just plain false partisan presentation on CBS radio, again in ~~the disguise of impartiality,~~ I intended that to be included also. ~~THESE~~ The purpose of this letter is to make this ~~request~~ explicit.

In order to restrict for radio what was culled out for radio, I respectfully request a copy of the radio script.

Prior to the airing of the radio version, I had been requested by several CBS stations to present the other side, a proper attitude I regret the network did not share. On ^{of} asked me if I would appear face to face with Mr. Midgley. To this, ^{also} I agreed. I was in New York at that time and left the ^{CBS} phone numbers at which ~~it~~ could reach me. I received no such call.

I tell you this for several reasons.
