Mr. GEORGE A. BOUNE, 4740 Homer Street, Apartment O, Dallas, Texas, was interviewed at 3752 Westcliff Road North, Fort Worth, Texas. He stated that he was doing accounting work for Mr. MACK CLARK and he had telephonically contacted Mrs.

BOUHE pointed out that the first thing he did was to buy some groceries, some baby clothes, and also a baby crib. BOUHE advised that subsequently he contacted two ladies in Dallas who were "his Russian friends" and they obtained some clothes for MARINA. He stated at the same time he had two shirts which were used but in good shape which he offered to LEE OSWALD, and OSWALD refused to accept them.

BOUHE stated that OSWALD was very arrogant when he refused to accept the shirts.

He stated regarding MARINA OSWALD that he considers her to be a product of the Soviet machine and that all initiative has been removed. He stated as an example, he along with two of the ladies tried to educate MARINA in minor things such as the use of Kleenex and cleanser in the house and she did not seem to grasp what they meant.

He stated also that he exerted considerable effort to teach MARINA OSWALD the English language and prepared simple tests such as teaching her to write and read that my husband goes to work. He stated after she had taken two or three lessons he sent her a fourth lesson which she never returned and never continued her effort to learn the English language.

BOUHE stated that in early September, 1962, OSWALD went to Dallas and attempted to obtain employment. He pointed out OSWALD stayed at the Y.M.C.A. in downtown Dallas for about a week and later moved to South Oak Cliff in Dallas. BOUHE stated he sent OSWALD to the Texas Employment Commission and after a few tries OSWALD obtained employment with Jaggars-Chiles-Stoval, Inc., as an apprentice printer. BOUHE stated two or three weeks after OSWALD obtained this employment, OSWALD telephonically contacted him every two or three days.

BOUHE stated that after about three weeks, OSWALD said something to the effect that don't worry, BOUHE, we've got everything under control and we will do all right.

BOUHE stated that from around the first of October, he did not see OSWALD again until December 27 or 28, 1962. He said OSWALD was at a party on one of these dates at which BOUHE was in attendance and they have had no contact or communication since that time.

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BOUHE stated during the time that he was in contact with the OSWALDs, the following events occurred:

BOUHE stated during the first two or three weeks that he saw the OSWALDs, he noticed on different occasions that MARINA OSWALD would have a black eye or a spot on her which she indicated to some of their mutual friends were caused by her husband beating her. BOUHE stated that he overheard women talking and MARINA indicated that OSWALD had hit her for smoking.

He stated he recalled on one occasion that one of the ladies received a telephone call from MARINA OSWALD, while the OSWALDs were in South Oak Cliff, and MARINA was at a service station and advised she had been beaten by LEE OSWALD and had no place to go. BOUHE stated that the friend picked up MARINA and she stayed with this friend for three or four days. He stated that thereafter they arranged for MARINA OSWALD to stay five days or a week at a house of one of the friends and then move to a second house for a second week, and this was to be continued until MARINA could make some arrangements or obtain employment.

BOUHE stated this lasted only two weeks because the third week OSWALD appeared at the house where she was staying and apologized to MARINA and induced her to return with him to South Oak Cliff in Dallas.

BOUHE stated that during this time MARINA OSWALD was to clean the house and run the sweeper, but apparently she did not do any of this. He stated that instead she would sleep until midday and would not try to cooperate and help herself.

He stated that this was the last he heard of MARINA OSWALD until June, 1963, when LYDIA DIMYTRUK stated that she had seen MARINA OSWALD and MARINA was living somewhere in Irving, Texas. He pointed out DIMYTRUK was employed by Whites Grocery Store in Irving, but resides at 3542 $\frac{1}{2}$ Kent Street in Fort Worth.

BOUHE pointed out that during the time OSWALD resided on Mercedes Street in Fort Worth, he (BOUHE) visited OSWALD's home he would say four times. BOUHE stated that he observed books written by KARL MARX and ENGLE, and OSWALD would point to these books and stated that "this is the book". BOUHE stated that he asked OSWALD why he did not return to Russia if he thought so much of these books and Russia, and OSWALD would not give him a direct answer.

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BOUHE stated that OSWALD said he had gone to Russia because he was enthusiastic about their system of government and opposed the bloody capitalism.

BOUHE said in his opinion OSWALD wanted to "shine" and also felt when he talked he was giving out "pearls of wisdom". BOUHE stated that OSWALD made statements that Russia would be the leader in the world and that Russian courts were courts of justice while the courts in the United States were a shambles.

BOUHE stated that in his opinion when OSWALD arrived in Russia OSWALD felt he would be an individual sought in Russia and that the Russians had seen through OSWALD and placed him in a menial job. He stated that in other words he felt that OSWALD went to Russia feeling that they would use him as a speaker and for propaganda.

BOUHE continued that OSWALD kept making statements that the capitalist system exploited the people, but OSWALD never gave a solid answer to BOUHE as to why OSWALD returned to the United States.

BOUHE stated he recalled that there was one instance where OSWALD mentioned he returned to the United States because MARINA desired to come to the United States.

BOUHE advised that he had never observed LEE OSWALD with any type of weapon or gun.

He advised that the only recollection he has of OSWALD mentioning his service in the U. S. Marine Corps was on one occasion OSWALD made application for employment at Sangers Department Store in Dallas, Texas, and BOUHE helped OSWALD fill out the application. He stated the application had a space for military service and BOUHE asked OSWALD what about his discharge from the Marines. OSWALD said "put down honorable", and that is what BOUHE put on the application.

BOUHE advised that the only time OSWALD mentioned anything about any contact with any Government official was when he said the American Embassy in Russia had given him (OSWALD) money to return to the United States. He stated OSWALD had indicated he still owed for money he obtained from the Embassy.

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BOUHE stated that he never heard OSWALD mention any other Government official or agency.

He stated that his primary reason for maintaining contact with OSWALD was the interest he had in helping MARINA OSWALD. He stated that in his opinion all of the people that were associated with the OSWALDs during the summer and fall of 1962 were more interested in helping MARINA OSWALD.

BOUHE stated that he felt strongly that OSWALD was a rebel, a misfit, no good for society, and very arrogant.

BOUHE stated that OSWALD seemed to be against everything and for nothing.

He stated that the following were associated with the OSWALDs, and in particular, MARINA OSWALD:
