My wife and I were pleased to learn you are back at work (a mixed blessing!) and in good spirits.

Perhaps, you are too harshly critical of your own excellent judgements. It is naive for you to believe that 'we really had the opportunity to reverse events and to establish definitively the innocence of Oswald and the operation of a highly sophisticated conspiracy'.

Objectively speaking, Dr. Wecht's analysis again established the systematic destruction and prestidigitation of vital evidence and the existence of a conspiracy at the highest levels to conceal the truth of the J.F.K. assassination.

I might add that Dr. Lattimer's article in the May Resident and Staff Physician substantiated this.
