Dear Ed,

You are a sweetheart to continue sending me assassination news stories even at this distance in space and time. Almost everything you send me is new to me and all of it is most warmly appreciated. The special report on the Sirhan case in the National Tattler, received this morning, is most interesting and valuable because it seems to consolidate all the dribs and drabs of information which has emerged during the past few years.

I have become an almost completely passive observer of the assassination scene, and also of course of the Watergate arena. Even so, I am hard pressed for space for all the newspapers and magazines accumulated in the last two years, mainly on Watergate.

One by-product of my passivity is that I have been taking better care of my health. My weight and blood pressure had shot up to astronomical heights. I started a new regime at end of February with the result that I have lost fifty pounds and my blood pressure is down from 180 to 135. But I will have precious little vacation this year, as my boss is going on home leave to Greece and I have to supervise the office in his absence.

I hope that you and the family are well and happy.
