

## FEDERAL BUREAU OF INVESTIGATION

Lieutenant CARL DAY, of the Crime Laboratory, Dallas Police Department, advised that during the afternoon of November 22, 1963, he removed a small piece of wood which had the color green painted on two sides; one side was painted pink and one side was unpainted. He stated he removed this wood from the bottom window sill where it was nailed for the purpose of examining it for latent fingerprints.

The window where this wood was located is situated on the sixth floor of the Texas School Book Depository Building, where it was believed that LEE HARVEY OSWALD fired the shots that killed President KENNEDY and struck Governor JOHN CONNALLY. DAY related that, prior to the time he was to examine this wood, it was decided that it should be turned over to the FBI and sent to Washington, D. C., for examination by the FBI Laboratory and he, accordingly, furnished this item to Captain GEORGE DOUGHTY, Crime Laboratory, who, in turn, released this item to representatives of the Dallas FBI Office.
