TITN, 1207 South Selva, was interviewed at his place of business, "Honest Joe's Pawnshop"; 2524 Elm Street, Dallas, Texas. GOLDSTEIN advised on the morning of November 22, 1963, he was driving an old Edsel sedan in the vicinity of the Texas School Book Depository Building. He stated the car was brightly painted and carried slogans advertising his pawnshop. GOLDSTEIN said the police permitted him to drive on the route used by President JOHN F. KENNEDY's Motorcade. He stated, however, that he was parked on Pacific Avenue, one block from the parade route, when President KENNEDY was shot. He said a television technician from a Dallas television station shouted that someone had shot the President. GOLDSTEIN said he does not know LEE HARVEY OSWALD and cannot recall having seen him at any time. He stated that JACK RUBY purchased some equipment from him a few years ago; however, he is not a personal friend of JACK RUBY and has had no other business dealings with him since that time. GOLDSTEIN stated he considered the assassination of President KENNEDY a most tragic happening. He could offer no further information of value.
