when I telephoned you some days age, I forgot to mention a small matter which, for the record, I should like to clear up. You may remember that when you visited me in 1984 you raised the question of the death of Albert Guy Bogard and why it had been emitted from my chapter "Death and Misadventure". My memory failed me at that time but recently I found that I did mention Bogard's death in my book, in a feetnote on page 302.

The feetnete refers to the death of Albert Cuy Bogard in February 1966, allegedly by suicide (asphyriation in a parked car) which was brought to light in July 1967, too late for inclusion in the "Death and Misadventure" chapter, which was already on the press.

I am looking forward to receiving the outline of your book, for which I have great hopes. We need more books, good books, to keep this subject alive in the interests of an accurate historical recerd and justice to the innecent.
