I have put slips in where I think it might be possible.

In return I'd settle not for cash but for trade-deal ads.

Jim Lesar borrowed the money to pay the printer. We have, among our special problems, the fact that all but two of the major wholesalers with whom I have dealt having gypped me out of many thousands of dollars, so I can't distribute through them. And while Jim understood this and still felt he had to run the risk to bring this out, particularly for the influence it could have on the course of amending the Freedom of Information law, I am anxious for him to be able to pay the debt off. And stop paying interest on it.

Addressing envelopes and licking stamps are not the way I'd prefer to spend time but at the moment it is the only way we can distribute. So ads that could direct orders to me would be satisfactory pay if you can go for any of these or probably other individual items that can stand alone.

I've marked the nonsensical explanation Warren gave for taking the job he knew no Justice should take. If he could believe LBJ on this what could mere mortal not believe?

Then there is the omission by the FBI of the Oswald notebook pages with Hosty's name, number and car license and the "explanation."
