I did some more research in Senator Cooper's archives, which were recently reclaimed from his brother, Dick. When I last went, the Warren Report part of the archives took up one-half of a 6 inch wide box. Bill Cooper has added two entire boxes. Much of this material was stamped "Top Secret" and included the January 27th transcript and some depositions, etc. Some interesting personal correspondence, nothing earth shattering, but I will make copies and send you next week. Still no copy of Whitewash.

I now have the 26 volume Exhibits! They are in very good shape. I have been reading a lot of the depositions. I was especially interested in the deposition of a disc jockey called the "Weird Beard". His comments about Ruby were very interesting. The Weird Beard was our big top 40 DJ in Louisville in the late 1960s and early 1970s. I never had any idea he knew Jack Ruby and was one of the last people to talk to him before he shot Oswald.

I will send you an order for some more books next week and the Senator Cooper information. Probably the only thing you don't have is the personal correspondence.

I thought you came across very well on the "Who Shot Martin Luther King" show. I thought it went very well.
