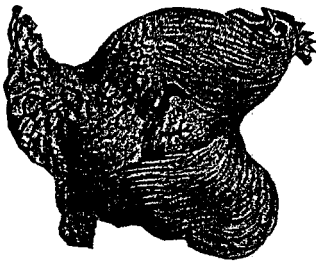




Partridge Cochins

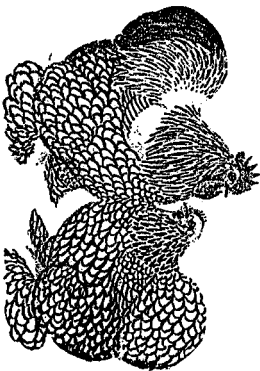
