As things now stand, I will be at your house at 9:00 a.m. on Friday, April 7th.



Rift between Nunn and Forgy widens

FRANKFORT (AP) — For 30 years, Larry Forgy has been what amounts to the political ward of Louie Nunn.

Nunn said he made it possible for Forgy to go to work in Washington as a college student and complete his education there. Since then, Nunn said he has recommended Forgy for virtually every job he has had, including budget director in his own administration, at the University of Kentucky and as a lawyer at Wyatt, Tarrant & Combs, the largest law firm in the state. Nunn said he supported

Forgy during forays into governor's races in 1983, 1987 and 1991.

Nunn said the relationship ended almost quietly, as he has not heard from Forgy in nearly two years. But Nunn is now fuming.

Nunn, the last Republican governor of Kentucky, has announced his support for Bob Gable in the GOP primary. It is a bitter split that has left Nunn and Forgy tense and irritable.

"I just want the truth," Nunn said Wednesday. "I'm an old man and I don't intend to be smeared by a man that I carried longer than his mother did." Forgy acknowledged that he

said the "price was too high" for Louie Nunn's support in the Republican primary. "I don't intend to elaborate on that," Forgy said Wednesday.

"After all these years, I'm sorry it's come to this, but if he's for Mr. Gable, that's where he is," Forgy said.

Gable also served in Nunn's administration as parks commissioner, but the two have long been factional opponents in the party. Nunn said he always respected Gable.

"Now, politically I was never on his side," Nunn admitted. What prompted Nunn's strong

remarks were some comments by Al Cross, the political writer for The Courier-Journal, during an appearance on Kentucky Educational Television last week.

Cross said speculation was that Nunn wanted his son, Steve, to be Forgy's running mate and that Nunn wanted to be able to choose some top appointments in a Forgy administration. In addition, Cross said the Forgy camp felt Nunn wanted to take the job of governor.

As for the first two, Nunn said they were "absolutely untrue" and he offered Wednesday to drive to Kentucky State Police headquarters and take a lie detector test.
