Dear Major Greenberg

Your letter of the 5th captioned "Records Pertaining to Harold Weisberg" is another reminder of the amount of work people will waste in an effort not to perform what can be a simple task and as a direct consequence of regarding themselves as omniscient in FOIA matters. And PA.

It is like pushing wrong buttons on computers.

I have heard from the JAG's office.

When I filed the request I had no record of the case number identifications of the litigation that did involve Holling. But I did inform accurately within the requirement of the law, that I request identifiable records. I gave as sources of more precise case identifications the Civil Division of the Department of Justice and the federal district court in Baltimore.

I don't know why none of your people could have made the simplest inquiry. But it appears that it was better to waste time and money proving nothing.

If there had not been a stonewall in the Civil Division you'd have known earlier as I also would. They don't like me. Not only do I sue them and beat them I write books that do not equate J. Edgar Hoover with Christ and the DM with heaven. No, safe from prosecution from themselves, they stonewall. I finally duplicate the request of them in the name of my wife and the wall cracked a bit.

There have been referrals of files that were found. Several weeks ago I received notice that there were such referrals to the Air Force.

This was before the JAG letter and before your letter, long enough before each for each of the letter writers to have known this, too. Certainly if there were serious intention of doing as the Act requires after so long a period of time, both offices should have been informed.
