Dear Mr. Weisberg:

This responds to your letter of 28 February 1980 in which you inquire about the National Security Agency's (NSA) responses to the Freedom of Information Act and Privacy Act (FOIA/PA) requests from you and your wife. We are interpreting this letter as an appeal of your wife's request for information and as an inquiry into our handling of your own prior request and appeal to this Agency for information on yourself.

I have reviewed Lillian Stone Weisberg's request of 15 December 1976 to the Department of Justice, the document the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) forwarded to NSA in February 1980 in response to that request, and NSA's letter of 22 February 1980 to Mrs. Weisberg, which forwarded portions of that document to her. As the result of this review, I have determined that the document may be released in its entirety and it is enclosed.

You also mention that the document is inaccurate and you suggest that you may want to file a statement of disagreement. Therefore, in accordance with 5 U.S.C. §552a(d)(2), you may request amendment to that record. As we have stated in previous correspondence, this record was never located in NSA files. It was referred to us twice by the FBI pursuant to your FOIA/PA requests to that agency and the only place the record is held in this agency is with your FOIA/PA appeals files which we are required by law to keep for five years. Nevertheless, if you wish to file a statement of disagreement for incorporation into the FOIA/PA appeals files, please submit it to the Information Officer, National Security Agency/Central Security Service, Fort George G. Meade, MD 20755.

- 1. During the course of a background investigation of a prespective Agency employee by the Security Division, National Security Agency, information was developed that three alleged Government employees are reportedly associating or have consciuted with the above-captioned individuals.
- 2. Files of another Government agency reflect that Herold-WHISBER is was dismissed on 23 June 1947 from the Department of State because of indirect association with representatives of foreign powers. Files further reflect that Hrs. Lillian WEISBERG admitted that both she and her husband were members of an organization cited by the Attorney General.
- 3. The aforementioned Government employees are as follows: Hae CROWLEY, nee STONE, a sister of Mrs. Lillien WEIGRENS, reportedly a former employee of Naval Ordnance Laboratory; Of the CROWLEY, husband of Mae Stone CROWLEY, reportedly employed by Naval-Ordnance laboratory; and Robert STONE, brother of Mrs. Lillian WEIGRENS, reportedly a former employee of the Bareau of Canaus but recently transferred to another agency of the Government.
