[REDACTED] could furnish no information regarding poultry losses sustained by WEISBERG as a result of low flying helicopters.

He said he has seen helicopters fly over the WEISBERG farm. He was unable to say whether or not he considered any of these helicopters low enough to do damage to any of the poultry or livestock on the farm. He said he knows of no losses of any kind suffered by WEISBERG as a result of low flying helicopters. He said WEISBERG had a considerable number of his poultry die while he worked there. He does not consider these losses out of line with the normal losses sustained by any poultry raiser. He was unable to say what caused these losses, whether they were from natural or other causes. [REDACTED] was unable to furnish any information regarding the activities or operations of WEISBERG's farm other than to say he raises different kinds of poultry and sells eggs.

[REDACTED] said he has known WEISBERG for a number of years and knows him to be in the poultry business. [REDACTED] said he has seen helicopters fly over his own farm, however, he has never seen a helicopter flying over his house which he would consider too low. He pointed out that it is very difficult to judge the altitude of a helicopter flying over and for this reason could only say that he has never seen one flying at an altitude he would consider low enough to do damage to livestock or poultry.

[REDACTED] pointed out that WEISBERG's farmhouse and poultry houses sit on the side of a hill. The buildings are near the bottom of this hill which is 400 or 500 feet high. He also pointed out that there are large trees in the vicinity of WEISBERG's farm.
