This will respond to your letter, postmarked July 7, 1977, addressed to the undersigned and your June 24, 1977 letter addressed to Mr Charles A. Hinkle. The latter was received in our office on July 14, 1977.

Reference your letter mailed July 7, 1977:

a. Veterinary records relating to an investigation are held by the Staff Judge Advocate of the base conducting the investigation.

The policy of the Air Force is to provide the b. maximum amount of information possible that can be identified and located under either the Freedom of Information Act or the Privacy Act of 1974. However, your request for all documents would involve thousands of Air Force records covering a wide range of subject matter. The Privacy Act Issuances, 1976 Compilation, volume I, contains a complete listing of Air Force systems of records. The Federal Registers of September 29 and December 23, 1976 include amendments thereto. Please reference these documents at your local library, identify the system of records pertinent to your needs, and direct your request to the appropriate system manager. When requesting personal records you must give your full name, date and place of birth, and reasonable verification of identity.

c. The DCII Index contains material currently on file and includes "...what the military obtained elsewhere...".

In conversation with the Office of the Judge Advocate General, United States Air Force we were told they were responding to you with reference to their files.



Since your letter to Mr Hinkle refers to "Air Force Bolling Field" we have again asked 1100 ABW/DADF(MAC), Bolling AFB DC 20332 to respond to you on the points you raise.

We do not have any further information responsive to your request.
