

SUBJECT: Request for Records-Freedom of Information Act

1. Our Judge Advocate's office has again searched for any records pertaining to you. Unfortunately, there was no sign of any record whatsoever in our files.
2. There is also no record in this office that any of your records have been destroyed or transferred.
3. If the Judge Advocate's office did at one time have any of the records you seek, they may have been transferred to the Washington National Records Center, a part of the National Archives. Transfers of records to the Center are recorded on a Standard Form 135 titled, Records Transmittal and Receipt. Information as to the location or destruction of the record is noted on the Standard Form 135. All Standard Forms 135 reflecting all records transferred to the Center are on file in the Reference Branch of the Center. The files are arranged chronologically, according to the date of the records to which they pertain. It should be noted that if the records you seek are located at the Center, their release will still have to be approved by the Air Force through the appropriate DADF office. The files of Standard Forms 135 are open to the public from 8:00 AM through 4:30 PM, Monday through Friday at 4205 Suitland Road, Suitland, Maryland. You should call prior to going to the Center. The number is 763-7431.
4. Since you mentioned that you were involved in a court action in which the Air Force produced records, your request is being forwarded to the Litigation Division of The Air Force Judge Advocate General's Office through the appropriate DADF office. You will be receiving a response directly from them.
