1. Reference (a) advised of subject suit and requested this Department make the necessary arrangements to have plaintiff's counsel take the depositions of the Commanding Officer, U. S. Naval Air Station, Anacostia, Washington, D. C.; Commanding Officer, U. S. Naval Air Station, Patuxent River, Maryland; and the Commanding Officer, Marine Corps Air Station, Quantico, Virginia.
2. Reference (b) requested this Department arrange to have flight logs concerning helicopter flights in the Maryland area available at the time of the deposition taking.
3. The Commanding Officer, U. S. Naval Air Station, Patuxent River, will be available for the taking of a deposition at 1000 hours on 10 September 1959. The Commanding Officer, U. S. Naval Air Station, Anacostia, will be available for the taking of a deposition at 1000 hours on 4 September 1959. The Commanding Officer, Marine Corps Air Station, Quantico, will be available for the taking of a deposition at 1500 hours on 4 September 1959.
4. The Commanding Officers in question have been furnished with copies of the complaint in subject case and have been advised of your request that they have available flight logs concerning helicopter flights at the time of the deposition taking. It is understood that the depositions will be taken at the Headquarters of the respective Commanding Officers. It is further understood that the United States Attorney in charge of subject case will present himself at the Headquarters of the respective Commanding Officers sufficiently in advance of the time of deposition taking to advise the deponents concerning the particulars of the litigation and as to the nature of their testimony.
