Reference is made to your letter of December 15, 1976 in which you request certain material under the Freedom of Information Act. This letter constitutes a reply with respect to the United States Attorney's office for the District of Maryland.

A search of the records following your request revealed:

(1) Material originated by the Federal Bureau of Investigation. Your request and the documents have been referred to that organization for direct response to you. This referral is made pursuant to 28 C.F.R. 16.43 (a)(2).


(2) Fifty-one pages of material available for release less two excisions made pursuant to 5 U.S.C. 552 (b)(5), inter-agency or intra-agency memoranda or letters which would not be available by law to a party other than an agency in litigation with the agency. This material will be forwarded to you upon receipt of a check or money order, made payable to the United States Treasury, in the amount of \$5.10. This charge is made pursuant to 28 C.F.R. 16.9(b).

You may appeal my decision in this matter, within thirty days, by writing to the Deputy Attorney General, Attention: Freedom of Information Appeals Unit, Washington, D.C. 20530. The envelope and the letter should be

marked "Freedom of Information Appeal." Judicial review is thereafter available either in the district in which you reside or have your principal place of business; or in the District of Maryland, or in the District of Columbia.
